They are a welcome addition to the centre. Like many families, four years ago the Sarjas Family had to find a new home for their father Joseph as he could no longer stay in his home. They choose CapitalCare Strathcona because of its close proximity. Since then, the family has come together and become very involved in the centre. This includes sitting on various committees and dedicating a lot of their time raising funds for the centre. The bonus – Joseph always has family around!

The best piece of advice the family has to give for new families in the same situation is “it’s okay to get involved and it’s good to meet family members going through the same struggles as you.” Angela, Joseph’s daughter, says “Give where you live” because Dad’s community is our community now.

As a long time donor Joyce shares that making a donation every two weeks adds up at the end of the year. It makes a difference for taxes and best of all “you feel good” knowing you made an difference right where you work.”



Thirty years in

and the Rotary Club of Edmonton West has never stopped giving to CapitalCare Grandview. As an incredible example, and one of many, this service club has remained completely committed to ensuring quality living can happen for those living in long term care. In years past they put their minds to providing an accessible van for outings to hockey, football and country drives, then turned their attention to providing a beautiful addition called the Friendship Room, where access to a computer for website visits with family can occur. More recently their focus has been to bring quality music to residents by purchasing a Grand Piano for the centre and bringing in accomplished musicians such as Senator Tommy Banks on a monthly basis. Watching the residents react to the music has been marvelous, says Jerome Martin, Rotarian. “Music is just one of those things that transcends

beyond” says Ingrid Neitsch, Past President. Watching their faces light up, their toes tap and their bodies move with the music just shows that no matter how old, how forgetful, or how disabled, music remains one of those things that touches the soul.

The impact CapitalCare Foundation sees from groups like Rotary Club of Edmonton West is tremendous. We have service clubs helping at most of our ten centres, doing what they can to “create home” in long term care. Their support demonstrates wonderful community involvement, really speaking to the high value we hold for our seniors in care. They have so much to still share and give to us and as Jerome recalls, “just sitting and talking with them has left such a warm impression on me. I have loved my entire time helping at Grandview.”
